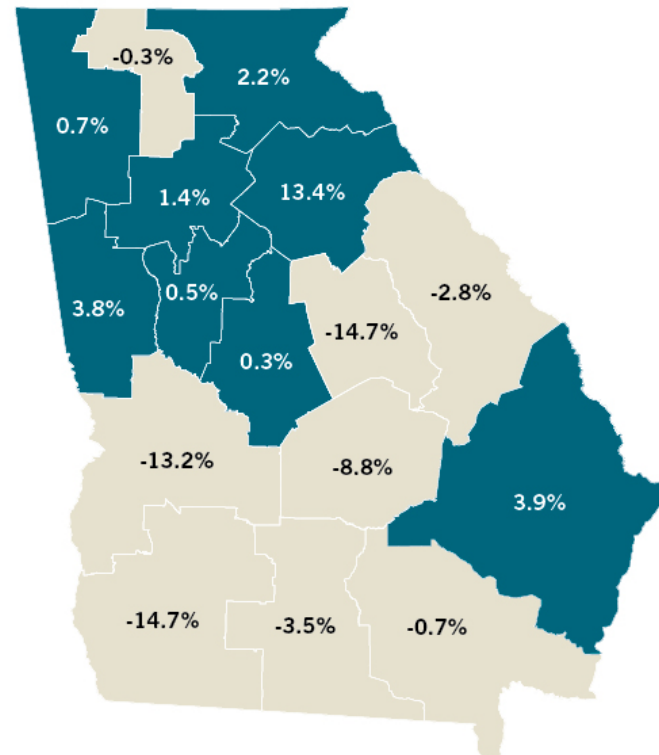

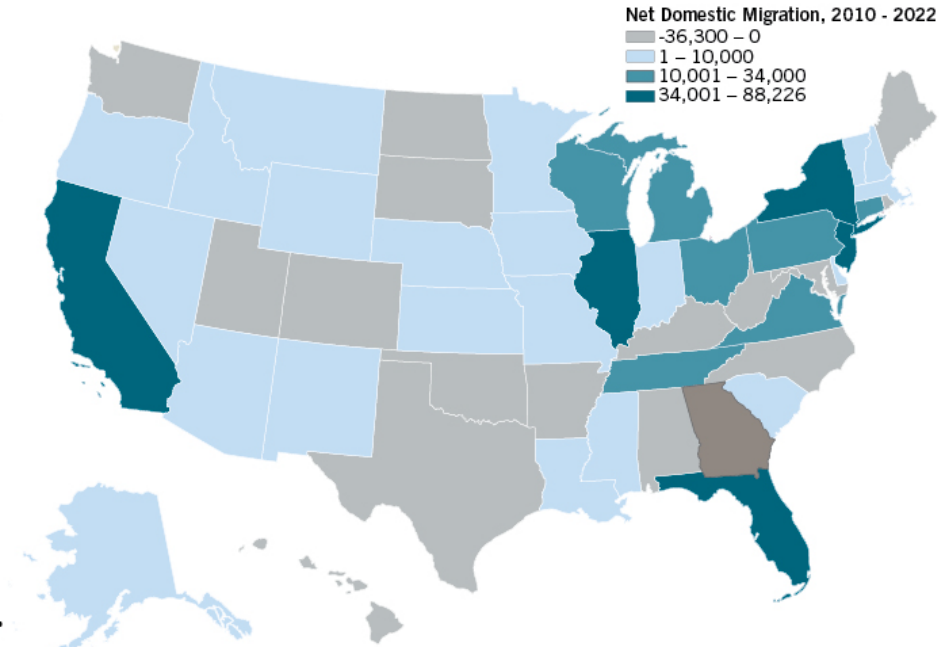
Domestic migration, or people who move to Georgia from other states, propels the peach state's population growth despite a declining birth rate.

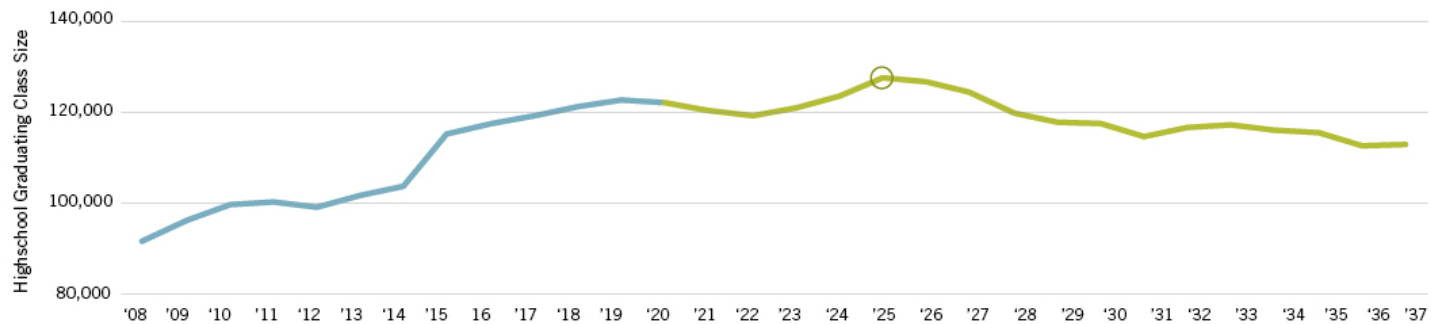

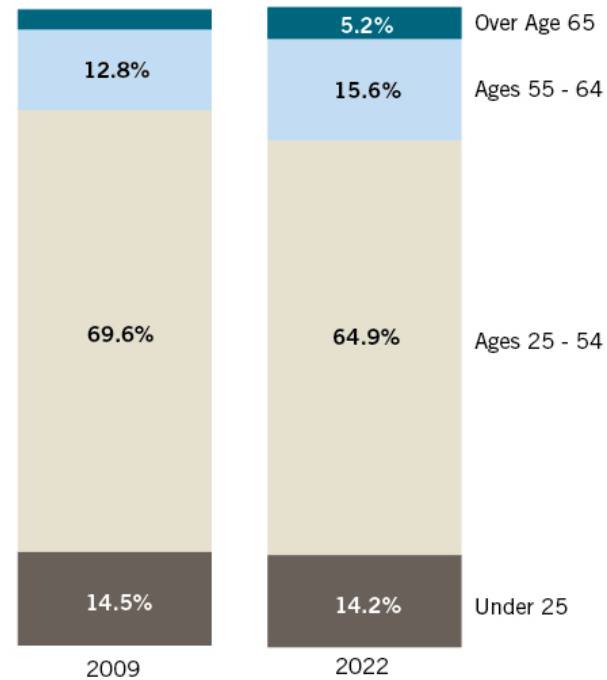

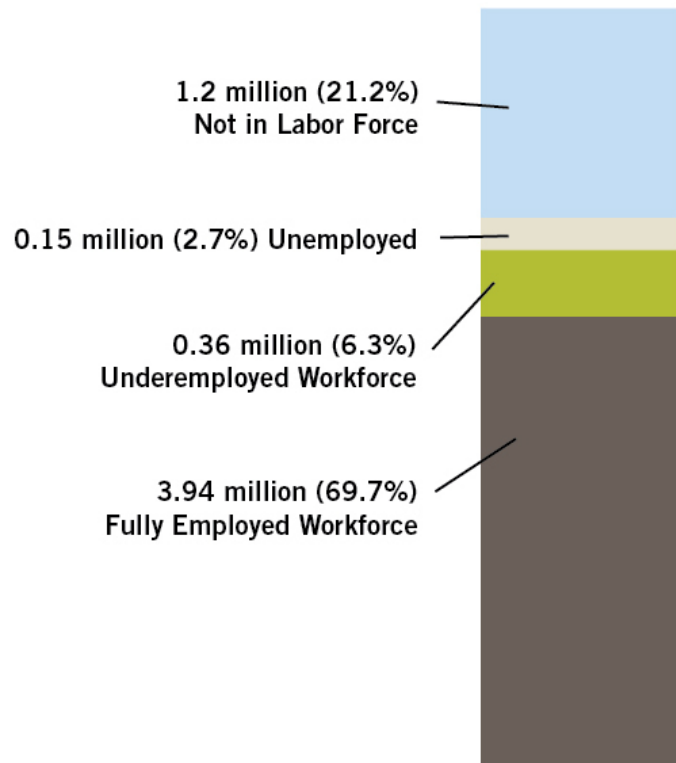
