

Buena Vista lands \$500K grant using Institute of Government designs



The City of Buena Vista was awarded a \$500,000 grant from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources based on renderings created by the UGA Institute of Government (shown above). The Land and Water Conservation Fund grant will support a \$1 million project called Josh Gibson Park. Plans for the park include a sports court, playground and amphitheater that will serve as an important centerpiece for community engagement. The design plans are a result of the institute's engagement with communities surrounding Fort Benning through the River Valley Community Compatible Development plan.
